The Policy, which has been approved by the Fiserv board of directors and contains policies and procedures for making, with corporate funds or assets, contributions and expenditures to participate or intervene in any campaign on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for public office, or otherwise influence the general public or any segment thereof, with respect to an election, ballot initiative or referendum, is available on Fiserv’s website. This report, which has been provided to the nominating and corporate governance committee of the board pursuant to its charter, shows political contributions made by Fiserv during calendar year 2025, as well as the non-deductible portion of payments to trade associations engaged in advocacy of \$50,000 or more and payments to other tax-exempt organizations that may be used for political purposes.
