This report, which has been provided to the nominating and corporate governance committee of the board pursuant to its charter, shows political contributions made by Fiserv during calendar year 2020, as well as payments to trade associations and other tax-exempt organizations engaged in advocacy of \$50,000 or more regardless of whether any portion was used for lobbying or other political purposes.
